





But there is a catch. Our J-1s must secure employment quickly or they must leave. That's where the IBO has concentrated its efforts this year, preparing them for the chaos of New York and the pressure of a job hunt, while striving to find them qualified employment through our network of members.

In recent years, too, we have become a truly inclusive and welcoming organization because, in our heart of hearts, we are as much an organization that is Irish in spirit, as it is by heritage. We are only as good as our membership, so we invite you to join us, so you can get to know us, and we can get to know you.

I extend my great thanks to all those that have made this occasion so splendid, especially our Advisory Board and Executive Board, who together form our 50th Steering Committee and have volunteered through many late evenings this year.

Let's continue, for many years into the future, to be guided and informed by these three words:

Network. Communicate. Reciprocate.

Attracta Lyndon 2006 – 2007. Lyndon's leadership was characterized by her dedication to community service and outreach.

Garret Corcoran 2008 – 2009. With Corcoran at the forefront, the IBO saw an influx of new members and an expanded range of services.

Niall O'Leary 2010 – 2011. O'Leary's tenure was marked by numerous collaborative events that enhanced the IBO's reputation. Sheila Lynott Hourican

2012 – 2013. Under Hourican, the organization amplified its focus on mentorship and professional development and marked its 40th in existence.

Sean McNeill (RIP) 2014 – 2016. McNeill's leadership was a beacon of resilience, determination, inclusivity, and unity.

Nicholas Malito

2017 – 2019. Malito's era witnessed a renewed focus on fostering international business ties.

John Lee 2020- 2021. Guiding the organization amidst global challenges, Lee's tenure was marked by resilience and adaptability in the face of a global pandemic.

Paul Finnegan 2022 – Present. The present torchbearer, Finnegan continues to uphold the IBO's legacy, carrying it forward with renewed enthusiasm and vision.

BERNADETTE MCMANUS | 1983

Our first female president, Bernadette was the catalyst for the IBO's origin story, a decade before. In her inimitable and determined style she broke through a ceiling or two, transforming an association that was solely the preserve of male native-Irish insurance professionals into an organization that allowed women and those of all identities and backgrounds to thrive. The organization that has gone on to be so inclusive and progressive, owes its very existence to Bernadette.

DYMPNA M. KENNY | 1986

Dympna took the reins of the IBO in 1986, a time when the Irish had come streaming back to the Big Apple due to a massive recession in Ireland that year. She offered a steady hand to the IBO during those tumultuous times, and in her career as a banker at Emigrant Savings Bank she helped many of these 'New Irish' get on their feet financially in their adopted city.

MAEVE O'MALLEY | 1993 - 1994

The early '90s saw Maeve take the reins of the IBO, marking the dawn of a transformative era. With a keen sense for business and community, Maeve emphasized expanding the IBO's reach, making it more inclusive and interconnected.


